RECOMMENDATIONS AND REMARKS.

Section 2 of Article VII of the State Constitution provides that "The following are declared to be perpetual funds for school purposes, of which the annual income only can be appropriated, to-wit: * * * All moneys arising from the sale or lease of sections number sixteen and thirty-six in each township in the State and lands selected or that may be selected in lieu thereof", while Section 7 of the same Article provides that "the income arising from the funds mentioned in the preceding section (school funds) together with all the rents of unsold school lands * * * shall be exclusively applied to the support of free schools in every County in the State."

By the provisions of the former section (2) it appears that the rental money derived from school lands must constitute a permanent fund the annual income of which only can be used, while the latter section (7) provides that it shall be exclusively applied to the support of free schools in every County in the State.

The Attorney General in an opinion rendered on this point to the State Auditor under date of June 16, 1892, says, after carefully reviewing the facts and citing authorities "I therefore state as my opinion that the rentals of such school lands, known as sections sixteen and thirty-six, and the lands selected or that may be selected in lieu thereof, do not constitute under our Constitution, or under any statutory provisions of the State, a per-

BUILDING FUNDS, ETC.

CAPITOL BUILDING SURPLUS.

This fund arises from the amount of tax collected for completion of the State Capitol in excess of the amount designated by law to be expended. The surplus is unavailable for any purpose as it now stands and should be, together with any further amount which may accrue to it from payment of delinquent tax, appropriated to the use of the Capitol Commission for the improvement of the Capitol building and grounds. Balances also remain in the

PENITENTIARY BUILDING FUND and POOR ASYLUM FUND,

which are unavailable for present needs under existing law, and should be appropriated for the benefit of the institutions for which they were originally intended.

SPECIAL ASYLUM FUND '92 and SPECIAL U. S. CONVICT FUND,

also require special legislation to make them available for use.

FISCAL REPORTS

Annual reports of fiscal officers as now required are necessarily incomplete for the requirements of the Legislature unless both reports issued between the regular sessions of that body are considered. If the fiscal officers were to report biennially, for the two years ending September 30th next preceding the convening of the Legislature in regular session, instead of annually as now required, the reports which would then come before the Legislature would be more comprehensive and valuable than under the present system.

Provision should also be made for the publishing of fiscal reports as soon as issued.

DEFINITIONS

The title, derivation and purpose of the several funds and accounts mentioned in this report are shown by the following synopsis:

General Fund. Arises mainly from State tax for general purposes and is augmented by certain fees of State officers and sale of Revised Statutes, Session Laws, condemned property, etc. All general appropriations are payable from this fund unless otherwise specified.

University Income Tax. The fund arising from the special tax for support of University authorized by Sec. 12 Chap. 75 S. L. 1890-91.

State Bond Tax. The fund arising from the special tax for payment of interest on State bonds, authorized by Sec. 2, Chap. 85 S. L. 1890-91.

The Fund for the Insane. The fund arising from the special tax for support of Insane Asylum authorized by Sec. 2 Chap. 93 S. L. 1890-91.

Capitol Tax. The fund arising from the special tax for care of State Capitol authorized by Sec. 16, Chap. 30, S. L. 1888.

Capitol Building Fund. Comprises the rents received from the State Capitol and is used in connection with "Capitol Tax" for care of the building. See Secs. 14 and 15, Chap. 30, S. L. 1888.

Capitol Building Surplus. Comprises the amount of tax collected for completion of State Capitol in excess of the amount authorized by law to be expended. See Secs. 14 and 15, Chap. 30, S. L. 1888.

Agricultural College Fund. The fund arising under Act of Congress approved Aug. 30, 1890, and referred to in Ch. 74, S. L. 1890-91.

Stock Indemnity Fund. Arises from special tax for live stock indemnity authorized by Sec. 4213 R. S. 1887. This tax has been discontinued according to the provisions of Chap. 12, S. L. 1890.

Penitentiary Building Fund. } Unexpended balances from funds
Poor Asylum Fund. } arising from sale of "Public Building Bonds" issued for
the purposes mentioned in chapters two and four of Ch.
30, S. L. 1888.

Fish Protection Fund. Fines received under the provisions of Sec. 16, Chap. 69, S. L. 1890-91.

Special U. S. Convict Fund. Fund created under contract with the United States for care of U. S. convicts as provided by Sec. 6, Chap. 37, S. L. 1890-91.

Common School Permanent Land Fund. Arises from percentage received on account of sale of lands by the United States under provisions of Sec. 7, Act of Admission, together with proceeds of sale of school lands granted to the State by the United States. See Sec. 38, Chap. 79, S. L. 1890-91, Sec. 4, Act of Admission, and Sec. 2, Art. VII of State Constitution.

Appropriations made for same purpose at different times or for different periods of time are distinguished from one another by the adding of the year in which the period covered begins.
