RECOMMENDATIONS AND REMARKS.

The accompanying report is the first to be issued under the law requiring biennial reports of this office, instead of annual. In this form the report covers all transactions for the entire period since the report made to the last legislature, and is, therefore, much more comprehensive, and more valuable for reference, than an annual report covering only one-half of the said period would be. By reference, however, to the statement showing a "Summary of All Cash Transactions," the receipts and expenditures for each year can be found in condensed form.

The report in many respects shows a very gratifying condition of the state's finances, and the following facts may be worthy of note in this connection:

THE GENERAL FUND.

This fund is shown by the report of September 30, 1898, to have been deficient in the amount of \$3,688.01. That is to say, warrants had been issued in that amount in excess of the balance available in said fund for their payment. The present report shows a net balance in the general fund, after allowing for outstanding warrants, of \$22,304.43; a net gain over two years ago of \$25,992.44. This improved condition has been brought about from various causes, principal among which may be mentioned the following:

First—The wisdom and economy of the Fifth state Legislature in reducing appropriations to the minimum amount consistent with a proper conduct of the state's affairs.

Second—The disposition of all state officials to keep the expenses of their several departments within the amounts appropriated. The indications are that very few, if any, of the departments will ask deficiency appropriations this year, which is an unusual condition.

Third—An increase in the taxable values of the state, by which a greater revenue is derived without increase in the tax rate. This condition enabled the state board of equalization to

reduce the tax levy for the year 1900 one-fourth mill from that of 1899, without menace to the general fund. It is confidently expected by the said board of equalization that with a continuation of the present economical management of the state government, a still further reduction in the tax rate may be made for the coming year.

Fourth—The large increase in amounts realized from the leasing of state lands. These land funds are used in many instances for the support of institutions which would otherwise be a charge upon the general fund. Without them the tax rate would necessarily be much larger than it is under the present conditions.

Fifth—An increase in taxes upon insurance companies, and in fees of the office of the secretary of state. While there has been a very material increase in revenue from the last named source, yet the treasurer would be derelict in duty if he did not refer to the intent of Chapter 61 of the Laws of 1899 (Secs. 3266 and 3267, R. S. 1899), which provides for the payment of fees to the state by certain corporations. It was the manifest intention of the legislature that said corporations should be made to pay the fees contemplated by said act. Although I understand that due notice has been given to all such corporations, certain ones have so far failed to respond. This law should be so amended as to designate the manner of enforcing payment of these matters. The necessity of this is apparent when it is known that the collection of the fees would add several thousand dollars to the general fund.

Sixth—The disposition and earnest effort on the part of many of the counties to pay up their delinquent state tax, which has resulted in much benefit to the general fund during the past two years.

While, for the reasons above given, the general fund is now in a good condition, it should nevertheless be borne in mind that this condition is not one which warrants extravagance in the future, and that only by a continuation of the present economical methods can the conditions be maintained.

DELINQUENT STATE TAXES.

This is a matter which has caused much comment in the past, and the statements in former reports of this office have shown a gradual and steady increase in the amounts due the state from this source. I am glad to report, however, a somewhat improved condition in this respect as compared with that of two years ago. At that time the total amount of delinquent

tax and accrued interest thereon was \$45,853.75, while at present it is but \$35,809.52. This condition promises a still further improvement during the coming year since a considerable portion of the amount now delinquent has been placed in judgment, and a special levy made this year for its payment, and some counties against whom judgment has not been rendered have voluntarily made special levies this year for the purpose of paying their delinquencies to the state.

THE LAND FUNDS.

The state is receiving at the present time greater benefit and income from its public lands than has ever before been realized. The register of the state board of land commissioners has paid into the state treasury during the past two years \$151,678.94, derived from the sale and lease of lands which were donated to the state by congress upon the admission of Wyoming to the union. The moneys derived from this source can be used only for the support of the several state institutions for which the land was donated. Our public schools come in for the largest share of the land rentals, some \$70,000.00 having been distributed among the school districts of the state during the past two years from this source, which amount will be very materially increased in the next biennial period.

While the revenue from this source has gradually increased in the past, it should be borne in mind that there is a limit to its growth, and that conditions may at times prevail which may reduce the amount below the present figures. It would, therefore, be unwise to rely upon an increase of revenue from this source proportionate with the past.

INVESTMENTS.

When any of the state lands are sold the money derived from such sale, must, by law, become a permanent fund, the interest upon which only can be used for the purpose for which the grant was made. It becomes the duty of the state treasurer to invest these permanent funds in school district or other bonds, or state warrants, and apply the interest received upon same to the purposes contemplated by law. There has accrued to the common school permanent land fund about \$48,000.00, which amount is being invested by the state treasurer, as opportunity occurs, in such securities as are permissible under the law. Great care has been taken in the matter of these investments to purchase only such securities as have been regularly and legally issued. Something over \$20,000.00 of this

fund is now invested in school district bonds of this state, as shown in the statement of investments, and the treasurer has, from time to time, been enabled to carry in this fund state warrants drawn against the general fund for which no money was available at the time, thus saving to the state the interest which would otherwise have been paid to the individual holders of such warrants, and at the same time enabling those having claims against the state to realize at once upon such claims without delay or discount.

The amount of the agricultural college fund thus far invested is small, but such securities as have been recommended and approved by the trustees of the university, having the matter in charge, have been purchased for said fund, and further investments in this line will undoubtedly be made in the near future. Some difficulty has been experienced in investing this fund because of the fact that securities in which it is permissible to invest cannot be secured at a price which will yield the rate of interest which the law requires shall be realized.

THE BONDED DEBT.

By the provisions of the act under which the "Capitol Building" and "University Building" bonds were issued, they will begin to mature during the coming year. The act provides that one-tenth (\$20,000.00) of said bonds shall be redeemed each year, and that a special tax levy shall be made each year sufficient to pay one-tenth of said bonds as aforesaid, together with the interest thereon. It appears that the holders of the bonds cannot be required to surrender the bonds faster than at the rate above named, and this fact precludes the possibility of refunding the entire issue, which otherwise could, undoubtedly, be done at a much lower rate of interest than the bonds now bear. The advantage of carrying out the plan of the original act in this matter, is that by so doing the debt will be gradually wiped out without great hardship upon the tax payers, which result it would seem is one greatly to be desired.

ADDITIONAL REVENUE.

Too much stress cannot be laid upon the wisdom of legislation looking to the increase of state revenues. This is a matter that is being seriously considered by nearly every state in the union. Numerous bills have from time to time been presented to former legislatures looking to this end, but from one cause and another have not become laws.

My predecessors in office have uniformly appealed to the

legislature to assess express companies, transportation lines owning freight cars, commonly known as "foreign cars," and owners of coal mines. The wisdom of the framers of our constitution has never been questioned, yet all these years have been allowed to pass and there has been no legislation looking to the taxing of the output of coal mines. The justice of such a tax is manifest. The express companies doing business in the state are deriving immense revenues, and yet are let off with a tax on the value of property owned in the state. It is my firm conviction that a bill should be passed taxing these companies on the volume of business transacted by them.

A law should be passed by the coming legislature similar to one now in successful operation in the state of Colorado. Every railroad company in that state is compelled to report to the state every foreign car that enters the state. The collection of such a tax in this state would add materially to our revenues.

CERTIFICATE OF STATE EXAMINER MADE UPON
AN EXAMINATION OF THE STATE TREASURER'S
ACCOUNTS ON SEPTEMBER 30, 1900.

It is hereby certified that the foregoing is a true and complete statement of the condition of accounts of the honorable state treasurer at the close of business September 30, 1900; that all receipts of such officer were carefully checked with the cash record and are set forth in detail therein, that the expenditures and the purposes thereof were found to be correct and that there was a voucher on hand for every expenditure with which the treasurer has credited himself.

I have not attempted to set out the amount that was due and owing to the state on account of delinquent state taxes for the reason that these matters appear fully in the treasurer's annual report. The treasurer has endeavored to collect all the delinquent taxes possible and as a result of his efforts the delinquent list is, at this time, materially reduced as compared with previous years.

During the period covered by this examination, investments in school bonds approximating \$17,000.00 have been made, the interest of which accrues to the common school land income fund. As a matter of fact there has been but one issue of bonds in the past year exceeding one thousand dollars that the state has not purchased. Mr. Abbott placed a bid on the Big Horn county bonds, but there was another bid offering a higher price and this bid was given preference. There is on hand in the permanent land income fund quite a large sum which will be invested in bonds as rapidly as the same can be obtained.

The accounts of the treasurer were found to be correct in every respect and reflect credit upon the treasurer and his efficient deputy.
