RECOMMENDATIONS AND REMARKS.

The accompanying report of the financial transactions of the State for the biennial period ending September 30, 1902, shows a condition of the State's finances which I think cannot be otherwise than gratifying to the citizens and taxpayers of the State. Never before in the history of the State has the financial condition been as favorable as at present, notwithstanding a large increase in the running expenses of the State due to the growth of its institutions and the consequent increase in the expenses of the several departments of the State.

The following facts may be worthy of note in reference to the present conditions as compared with the past:

THE GENERAL FUND.

In the biennial report of September 30, 1900, attention was called to the fact that the general fund of the State was in a much better condition than formerly shown. At that time there was a net gain of over \$25,000.00 in the fund as compared with the condition of same two years previous. The conditions which brought about this improvement have prevailed throughout the past two years, and this fund now shows a credit balance of \$86,562.89 as against \$23,385.96 two years ago. A gain of over \$63,000.00 in that fund. This condition has been brought about in spite of the fact that the tax levy for that fund has been reduced from 3 5-8 mills in 1900 to 3 mills in 1902, and also in spite of the fact that the demands upon this fund have been greater in the past two years than ever before. The expenditures from the general fund for the two years just ended were \$312,164.45 as against \$297,061.04 for the previous biennial period. It is believed that with a continuation of the present economical methods of the State that the tax levy for the general fund can be still further reduced to an appreciable extent during the next two years.

DELINQUENT STATE TAXES.

In the report of two years ago it was considered a matter for congratulation that the amount of delinquent State tax and

accrued interest thereon had been reduced from \$45,853.75 on September 30, 1898, to \$35,909.52 on September 30, 1900. This report shows that on September 30, 1902, there was but \$19,564.61 due the State from the counties on account of delinquent State tax and interest. There has been an earnest effort on the part of most of the counties of the State to rid themselves of the debt of delinquent State tax and many of the counties have levied special taxes for the payment of these accounts with the result that the indebtedness has been very materially decreased as shown by the above figures. Of the amounts now delinquent a considerable proportion has been placed in judgment and special tax levies have been made this year for the payment of these judgments in some of the counties, and indications are that the condition will be still further improved during the coming two years.

In this connection attention is called to the statement showing the percentage of taxes collected for the years 1900 and 1901. This statement shows that of the net amount levied for the year 1900, a little more than 99 per cent had been paid into the treasury previous to September 30, 1902, and that of the net amount of levy for the year 1901 nearly 97 per cent had been collected on that date. These figures are exclusive of interest upon delinquent tax for said years, and the showing is in every respect gratifying and reflects credit upon the county treasurers who have collected the state tax and paid it into the treasury, and is an indication of prosperous conditions throughout the State.

THE LAND FUNDS.

The receipts from the register of the State Board of Land Commissioners are also largely in excess of those of former years. A total of \$209,571.57 having been received from this source during the past two years as against \$151,678.94 for the previous two years. These amounts are exclusive of the percentage on sales of United States lands provided for in the act of admission and which amounted in the last two years to \$16,245.23 as against \$6,163.05 for the previous two years. It was pointed out in the last report that it should be borne in mind that there is a limit to the growth of the revenue from the land department and that conditions may at times prevail which will reduce the amount below the present figures and that it would therefore be unwise to rely upon an increase of revenue from this source proportionate with the past. This is probably more true today than two years ago and an increase in the receipts from this department for the coming two years over that of the two years just past is perhaps not to be expected.

INVESTMENTS.

The statement of investments shows an increase of over \$36,000.00 in the amount invested in school district and county bonds for the benefit of school funds. Since the date of this statement (September 30th) the amount has been still further increased by the purchase of \$16,000.00 of Albany county bonds, thus bringing the amount invested up to over \$72,000.00 and leaving at the present time less than \$20,000.00 of the Common School Permanent Land Fund uninvested. Every effort has been made by the treasurer to secure for this fund such bonds as are permissible by law to be purchased for the same, due care being taken at all times to see that they have been regularly and legally issued. The interest received from these investments during the past two years amounts to \$3,742.79 and the investments as they now stand represent an annual interest income of \$3,436.90. In securing these investments and determining upon the legality of their issue, the treasurer has been greatly assisted by the state examiner.

THE BONDED DEBT.

Pursuant to the provisions of the act under which the "Capitol Building" and "University Building" bonds were issued, a tax levy was made in the year 1901 sufficient to pay one-tenth of these issues on January 1, 1902, which was done. Thus reducing the bonded debt to \$300,000.00 at the present time. A tax levy has also been made for the year 1902 sufficient to pay the second installment of these bonds (\$20,000.00) which will become due on January 1, 1903. These payments of the bonded debt rapidly decrease the interest charges and such payments do not work a material hardship upon the taxpayers at the present time. Each payment of \$20,000.00 reduces the interest charge \$100.00 per month. It is believed that no better plan can be devised in relation to the bonded debt of the State than to continue the payment of these bonds by direct tax for that purpose as they become due. In this manner the debt will be gradually wiped out and the taxpayers will be relieved of the interest charges.
