RECOMMENDATIONS AND REMARKS

THE GENERAL FUND

It was considered a matter for congratulation at the time of the last biennial report of this office that the condition of the General Fund of the State was so satisfactory, having gained very materially over that of the report of two years previous.

I regret to state that this condition of the General Fund has not been maintained throughout the past two years. On September 30, 1902, there was a net balance in the General Fund, after deducting outstanding warrants, of \$86,093.89. On September 30, 1903, there was but \$13,691.07, and on September 30, 1904, if all warrants had been presented and paid, there would have been an overdraft in the General Fund of \$106.56. This condition and rapid decrease in this fund plainly show that the expenditures from this fund are greatly in excess of its revenues, and some action should be taken by the forthcoming Legislature either to reduce the expenditure or provide additional revenue.

The expenditures from the General Fund for the last four years have been as follows, to-wit:

For the year ending September 30, 1901...\$168,529.82
For the year ending September 30, 1902... 143,634.63
For the year ending September 30, 1903... 224,646.22
For the year ending September 30, 1904... 226,318.32

The tax levy for the General Fund for the past two years has been nearly, if not quite, up to the constitutional limit, and it is impossible to increase the revenues from this source faster than the natural increase of the taxable property of the State.

TAX ON OUTPUT OF MINES

A step was taken towards increasing the revenues of the State by the last State Legislature by the enactment of the law taxing the output of mines. We have not as yet realized any revenue from this source because of the fact that the law could

not be placed in full operation until the present year. The assessed valuation of the output of mines this year is something over \$792,000.00, which is a substantial increase in the State's valuations. The tax upon this assessment, however, will not be realized until the tax of 1904 has been collected and paid in to the State Treasurer. This valuation upon the output of mines will undoubtedly be increased from year to year as the State develops, and will be a substantial source of revenue in the future.

EXPRESS COMPANY TAX

Another law passed by the last Legislature was that providing for a tax upon express companies doing business in the State. This tax was to be based upon the receipts of the companies, and was thought by the framers of the law would apply to all receipts of said companies taken in at their offices within the boundaries of this State. In putting the law into force, however, it was contended by the companies that the State has no right to tax them upon interstate business, and could only levy upon such business as both originates and terminates within the boundaries of this State. This contention of the companies was upheld by the Attorney General in an opinion dated September 24th, 1903, and the result is that this tax has not realized as much to the State as it was expected it would. The total amount received from The Express Company Tax for the year 1904 was \$268.57, one-half of which goes to the General Fund of the State, and the balance is distributed among the counties through which the business of the companies is transacted.

DELINQUENT STATE TAXES

The amount due from counties on account of delinquent State taxes and interest is slightly greater than two years ago, at which time it was lower than for many years past. The amount of such delinquency and interest on September 30, 1904, was \$22,104.06, as against \$19,564.61 two years previous. Nearly all the counties of the State have made special efforts to rid themselves of the debt of delinquent State tax, and have kept the total down to a figure which does not seem unreasonable when it is taken into consideration that there is always more or less delay in making collections from individuals.

THE LAND FUNDS

The receipts from the Register of the State Board of Land Commissioners for the last two years have been considerably in excess of those of two years previous, which is a condition that was hardly to be expected, inasmuch as, as has been heretofore pointed out in the reports of this office, there is a limit to the

amount which it may be expected can be realized from this source. A total of \$292,421.21 was received from this source during the past two years, as against \$209,571.57 for the previous two years. A portion of this increase is due to an increased amount received from land sales, but the rents alone show an increase from \$179,155.54 to \$198,095.87, which is a very gratifying result. The amounts shown as received from the Register of the State Board of Land Commissioners are exclusive of the percentage on sales of United States lands, provided for in the Act of Admission, which percentage amounted in the last two years to \$17,221.87, as against \$16,245.23 for the two years previous; and are also exclusive of interest received by this office upon investments of Permanent Land Funds, mention of which is made elsewhere in this report. The percentage of sales of United States lands goes to the credit of "Common School Permanent Land Fund" and is not expended, but is held as a permanent fund, the interest of which only can be used for the support of the common schools of the State. In this connection attention is called to the report of the "Common School Land Income Fund" in which is shown the disbursements made to the several counties from this fund during the past two years. The total of such disbursements being \$142,760.39, rendering substantial aid to the public school system of the State.

INVESTMENTS

The investment of permanent funds by the State Treasurer, as provided by law, has been given careful attention during the last two years, with the result that at the present time the State has \$148,140.00 invested in school district, county and city bonds of this State. Special care has been taken in the investment of this money to secure only such bonds as have been regularly and legally issued, and those now held are considered to be first-class in every respect. The investment of these funds in local securities has the double advantage of benefiting both the State and the county or school district from which they are purchased, and the interest is kept at home. The interest received from these investments during the past two years amounts to \$12,190.17 as against \$3,742.79 for the two years previous. The present investments as they now stand represent an annual interest income of \$7,652.72, being an average of about 5 1-6 per cent. on the amount invested. In securing these investments and determining upon the regularity of the issue, the Treasurer has been greatly assisted by the State Examiner, and the legality of said issues has in all cases been passed upon and approved by the Attorney General, and the purchase has been approved in all cases by the Attorney General and the Governor, as required by law.

The State is without proper conveniences for keeping these bonds which are held by the State Treasurer as an investment

of permanent funds. We now hold nearly \$150,000.00 of these bonds, and have to depend upon the kindness of local bankers to store them for us in burglar-proof safes. I wish to recommend the purchase of a small burglar-proof safe with time lock, to be placed in the vault in the State Treasurer's office for the purpose of storing these bonds and such cash as is necessary to keep in the Treasurer's office for daily use. An appropriation of \$1,200.00 will, I think, be sufficient for this purpose.

THE BONDED DEBT

It is with pleasure that we call attention to the steady reduction of the amount of the bonded debt of the State. Under the provisions of the act under which the "Capitol Building" and "University Building" bonds were issued tax levies have been made each year for the past four years sufficient to pay one-tenth of the original issues, and the bonded debt of the State has thus been reduced from \$320,000.00 in 1901 to \$260,000.00 at the present time. The levy of 1904 will raise sufficient funds with which to cancel \$20,000.00 of bonds on January 1, 1905, thus reducing the bonded indebtedness at that time to \$240,000.00. These payments of the bonded debt rapidly decrease the interest charges, and such payments do not work a material hardship upon the taxpayers at the present time. Each payment of \$20,000.00 reduces the interest charges \$100.00 per month.

It is believed that no better plan can be devised in relation to the bonded debt of the State than to continue the payment of these bonds by direct tax for that purpose as they become due. In this manner the debt will be gradually wiped out and the taxpayers will be relieved of the interest charges.
