Recommendations and Remarks.

This report has been prepared with a view to giving full information in detail of all fiscal transactions of the past two years. Each cash fund is reported separately, showing the amounts received and expended in each case, and a detailed statement of the condition of the appropriation accounts is also given. Owing to the large number of cash funds and the liability to confusion of titles, reference to the law creating the fund, or governing its use, is given in each case.

LEGISLATION REQUIRED.

Some of the funds in the treasury are not available for use, owing to limitations or absence of statute in reference thereto, among which may be noted the following:

UNIVERSITY GYMNASIUM FUND.

Under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 48, Session Laws 1903, there have been tax levies made sufficient to repay the loan from Agricultural College Funds authorized by Section 2 of said chapter, and a balance exists in the University Gymnasium Fund of \$872.07 after repaying said loan in full. This balance, together with further amounts which may be received from the uncollected balances due from said tax levies, should be disposed of by act of Legislature by appropriating it to some special purpose.

PENITENTIARY IN ALBANY COUNTY LAND INCOME FUND.

Under the fourth subdivision of Section 625, Revised Statutes, this fund is made available "for the support and maintenance of the penitentiary located in Albany County and the care and subsistence of the convicts therein." Since the removal of convicts to the Rawlins penitentiary this fund has lain idle, and some provision should be made for its use, not inconsistent with the act of Congress which created it.

SHERIDAN HOSPITAL INSURANCE FUND.

This fund was created by the payment into the state treasury of money arising from payments by insurance companies for

loss by fire at the Sheridan Hospital. No authority of law exists for the use of such money even to repair the damage for which it was paid. The damage in this case having been made good by expenditure from the maintenance funds of said hospital, it would seem just and proper that this money should now be transferred to the "Sheridan Hospital Maintenance Fund."

THE GENERAL FUND.

The condition of the General Fund from time to time is a fair indication of the ability of the state to meet its obligations for the ordinary running expenses of government. This fund is the one from which nearly all of the general appropriations are paid, and as such appropriations are made without exact knowledge at the time of what the income in that fund is to be, it is always a matter of some anxiety on the part of the fiscal officers of the state to determine as to the ability of the fund to meet the obligations upon it. At the time of the last biennial report of this office (September 30, 1904) it was shown that if all warrants drawn against the general fund had been presented and paid, there would have been an overdraft at that time of \$106.56, and there was still three months' expense to accrue before there would be material relief. It is a pleasure, therefore, to compare the condition of two years ago with that of the present time (September 30, 1906). At this time there is a net balance in the fund, after allowing for outstanding warrants, of \$26,470.54, or an improvement over the condition of two years ago of \$26,577.10. The present balance will go far toward covering the expenses of the next three months, or until the tax of 1906 is collected and paid in to the treasury, but there will still be some deficiency within that time, notwithstanding the improved condition over that of two years ago. DELINQUENT STATE TAX.

The total amount due the state on account of delinquent state tax and interest thereon differs but slightly from that of two years ago, but the condition of these accounts is in some respects much more satisfactory than at that time. All of the very old accounts have been paid up and there is nothing now delinquent prior to tax of 1900 and the greater part is for very recent years and will be paid probably in due course without hardship upon the counties.

THE LAND FUNDS.

The rentals from leased lands have amounted to \$248,997.49, an increase of \$50,901.62 over receipts from same source of previous two years. This increase has been very largely in the Common School Land Income Fund, which, taken with the increase in interest on deferred payments and interest on Permanent Funds invested, has swelled the total distribution in aid of public schools from \$142,760.39 during the two years ending September 30, 1904, to \$196,102.23 during the last two years. The distribution of 1906 amounted to approximately \$4.78 per pupil.

The amounts shown as received from the Land Department are exclusive of the percentage on sales of United States lands, provided for in the act of admission, which percentage amounted in the last two years to \$23,261.89, as against \$17,221.87 for the two years previous, and are also exclusive of interest received from investments of Permanent Land Funds, mention of which is made elsewhere in this report. The percentage of sales of United States lands goes to the credit of the "Common School Permanent Land Fund" and is not expended, but is held as a permanent fund, the interest only on which can be used for the support of schools.

INVESTMENTS.

Special attention has been given by this office to the investment of permanent funds, as provided by law, and no opportunity has been allowed to pass for securing desirable bonds coming within the prescribed limits of law. Failure to secure such has occurred only in cases where through competitive bidding other investors have offered more than the state. The result is that the state now holds \$217,708.00 of desirable bonds as an investment of its permanent funds—an increase of \$69,568.00 over the amount held two years ago, notwithstanding that \$32,432.00 of the bonds held at that time have since been paid. The interest collected and paid into the treasury on these investments has amounted in the period covered by this report to \$17,724.56, as shown in detail elsewhere. The bonds now held represent an annual income of \$10,208.56, being an average of about 4.7 per cent on the amount invested.

In securing these investments and determining upon the regularity of issue, the Treasurer has been greatly assisted by the State Examiner and the Attorney General. The legality of issue has in all cases been passed upon and approved by the Attorney General and the purchase approved by that official and the Governor, as required by law.

The Treasurer has continued the practice of former years of investing permanent funds in Wyoming State warrants when-

ever there has been temporary lack of funds for payment of same when presented. A total of \$85,363.83 of state warrants has been handled in this manner during the last two years, resulting in an interest charge to the general fund of \$1,049.74, and a corresponding credit to other funds. This plan has the double advantage of retaining the interest in the treasury and at the same time avoiding inconvenience and, often times, expense to the holders. It also maintains the credit of the state through the fact that its warrants are always cashed upon presentation. Attention was called to the fact in the last report of this office, that the state is without proper conveniences for keeping the bonds which are held by the State Treasurer as an investment of permanent funds, and is dependent upon the kindness of local bankers to store them in burglar-proof safes. It is recommended that a small burglar-proof safe with time lock be purchased and placed in the vault in the State Treasurer's office for the purpose of storing these bonds and such cash as is necessary to keep on hand for daily use.

THE BONDED DEBT.

The bonded debt has been reduced \$100,000.00 in the last five years, resulting in reduced interest charges of \$6,000.00 per annum. The levy of 1906, already made, will raise sufficient funds with which to cancel an additional \$20,000.00 of bonds on January 1, 1907, thus reducing the bonded debt to \$200,000.00 on that date. This gradual reduction of the bonded debt is being accomplished without hardship upon the taxpayers—the levy for this purpose being less now than ten years ago when the interest charge only had to be provided for. It is believed that no better plan can be devised in relation to the bonded debt of the state than to continue the payment of these bonds by direct tax for that purpose as they become due. In this manner the debt will be gradually wiped out and the taxpayers will be relieved of the interest charges.
