## Report of the State Treasurer

### Recommendations and Remarks

This report has been prepared with a view to giving full information in detail of all fiscal transactions of the past two years, and the financial condition of the State at the present time. Each cash fund is reported separately, showing the amounts received and expended in each case, and a detailed statement of the condition of the appropriation accounts is also given. Owing to the large number of cash funds and the liability to confusion of titles reference to the law creating the fund, or governing its use, is given in each case.

#### PENITENTIARY IN ALBANY COUNTY LAND INCOME FUND.

Attention was called in the last biennial report of this office to the fact that under the fourth subdivision of Section 625, R. S. 1899, this fund is made available "for the support and maintenance of the Penitentiary located in Albany County and the care and subsistence of the convicts therein." Since the removal of convicts to the Rawlins Penitentiary, this fund has lain idle, and under existing conditions cannot be used for any purpose whatever, since the old Penitentiary in Albany County, for which this fund was provided, has been devoted to other purposes. We would renew the recommendation that some provision should be made for the use of this fund, now amounting to over \$8,000.00, not inconsistent with the Act of Congress which created it.

#### THE GENERAL FUND.

Notwithstanding that the expenses of State Government have largely increased during the past two years, due to the natural growth of the State, the revenues have kept pace with the expenditures without an increase of rate of taxation for general purposes, but rather with a somewhat decreased rate of taxation for



such purposes. The fact that the assessed valuation of the State has increased from \$51,223,202.87 in 1906 to \$67,580,051.12 in 1908, has made it possible to raise sufficient revenue for general purposes with a decreased rate of taxation. It is true that the total tax rate for the years 1907 and 1908 has been slightly greater than for the two years previous. This fact, however, is the result of special tax levies for construction of new buildings rather than expense of State government, the levy for which has been decreased.

At the time of the last biennial report of this office, (September 30, 1906) it was shown that there was a net balance in the General Fund at that time, after allowing for outstanding warrants, of \$26,470.54. The present condition of the General Fund, (September 30, 1908), is that of a net balance of \$31,228.21, a somewhat better condition than prevailed two years ago. The present balance will go far toward covering the expenses of the next three months, or until the tax of 1908 is collected and paid into the treasury, but it will be barely sufficient for that purpose, and no doubt some deficiency will exist before the tax is paid in. The total receipts and expenditures of the General Fund for the last six years have been as follows:

#### DELINQUENT STATE TAX.

The amount of delinquent State Tax and accrued interest thereon to September 30, 1908, is considerably larger than has been shown in any previous report of this office. This condition, however, is due very largely to the fact that the levies have been for greater amounts during the last two years than previously. The percentage of total levy collected upon the tax of 1907 is only slightly lower than the percentage of collections upon tax of 1905, two years ago. The statement of Delinquent State Tax, appearing in this report, shows an improved condition with respect to delinquencies of long standing. There is now no delinquency of any considerable amount upon taxes levied prior to 1905. There are also some large claims for rebates on file which are being checked up by the State Examiner, and which will undoubtedly be allowed, thus reducing the amount delinquent to a considerable degree.

#### THE LAND FUNDS.

The rentals from leased lands have amounted to \$284,797.29 during the past two years, which is the largest amount ever received from this source during any biennial period. The receipts from sales of State lands are also largely in excess of those of the previous biennial period, there having been received from this source during the last two years \$90,051.67, as compared with \$28,560.01 for the previous biennial period.

The receipts from all sources for the Common School Land Income Fund have been greater than ever before and the distribution in aid of public schools during the two years ending September 30, 1908, has amounted to \$223,562.13, being approximately \$3.80 per pupil for the year 1907 and \$4.89 per pupil for the year 1908.

The amounts shown as received from the Land Department are exclusive of the percentage on sales of United States lands provided for in the Act of Admission, which percentage amounted in the last two years to \$32,555.89, as against \$23,261.89 for the two years previous, and are also exclusive of interest received from investments of permanent land funds, mention of which is made elsewhere in this report. The percentage of sales of United States lands goes to the credit of the "Common School Permanent Land Fund" and is not expended, but is held as a permanent fund, the interest upon which only can be used for the support of schools.

#### INVESTMENTS.

The State Treasurer has given special attention to the investment of permanent funds, as provided by law, and no opportunity has been allowed to pass for securing desirable bonds coming within the prescribed limits of law. The amount invested in interest bearing bonds and securities on September 30, 1908, was \$300,710.44, being a net increase of \$83,002.44 over that of September 30, 1906. The securities now held are yielding an income equivalent to \$14,258.50 per annum, or an average of 4 7/8 per cent. The total amount received from interest on investments for the two years past has been \$22,229.09, as shown in detail elsewhere in this report.

In securing these investments and determining upon the regularity of issue, the Treasurer has been greatly assisted by the State Examiner and the Attorney General. The legality of issue has in all cases been passed upon and approved by the Attorney General, and the purchase of the securities approved by that official and the Governor, as required by law.

The Treasurer has continued the practice of former years of investing permanent funds in Wyoming State Warrants whenever



there has been a temporary lack of funds for payment of same when presented. The amount of funds invested in State Warrants on September 30, 1908, was \$21,124.44, all of which warrants were issued under the provisions of Chapters 13 and 16 of the Session Laws of 1907 in anticipation of funds to be received from tax levies provided for in said acts.

A special effort has been made to purchase County, School and Municipal bonds of the State. This has been of great advantage in several instances to certain communities where no bids for bonds were received except that of the State Treasurer. The State also derives a great benefit in being able to obtain a greater interest on the bonds than that received on deposits.

#### THE BONDED DEBT.

The Bonded Debt of the State is being gradually reduced by the payment of bonds as fast as they become due. The Bonded Debt at the present time is \$180,000.00, if we exclude \$2,000.00 of bonds which became due January 1, 1908, but which have not as yet been presented for payment. An earnest effort has been made to locate the holder of these bonds, but without success. A sufficient levy has been made to cover payment of \$20,000.00 of bonds falling due January 1, 1909, at which time the debt will be reduced to \$160,000.00.

#### THE DEPOSITORY LAW.

The Depository Law, enacted by the Ninth State Legislature, has been put into effect during the past two years, and on the whole has worked very satisfactorily and with very beneficial results to the State. The Law went into effect on May 1, 1907, and the total amount of interest on deposits received for the seventeen months ending September 30, 1908 was \$12,047.51. Only \$9,879.56 of this amount is accounted for in the present report because of the fact that the last quarter's interest, amounting to \$2,167.95, was not received in time to be included in the accounts of September 30, 1908. Strict compliance with law has been observed in the matter of taking security from Banks in which deposits have been made. Owing to the fact that a large proportion of the revenues of the State are paid into the Treasury at one time and again disbursed within a short period, it has been found difficult to comply strictly with the law relative to the limitation which provides that deposits shall not exceed fifty per cent. of the capital and surplus of the depository bank. In all cases, however, where such excess has become a temporary necessity, securities have been furnished by the bank covering the whole amount of deposit. The operation of the law appears to

have been beneficial in that the Treasurer has been able under the provisions in this statute to distribute the funds of the State, which are not required for immediate use, throughout different localities where it is used by the banks and has undoubtedly been beneficial to the community. The State Board of Deposits has designated altogether some thirty-five depository banks. It has been impracticable to place deposits in all these designated depositories, but distribution has been made to all parts of the State and in such manner as appears to the Treasurer to be most beneficial to the State and all concerned.

In making deposits in banks, not active depositories, care has been taken to avoid as much as possible the necessity of quickly withdrawing same, as in this case the deposit would be more of a detriment than a help to the bank in question.

#### THE STATE GAME FUND.

Under the provisions of Chapter 102 of the Laws of 1907 it was provided that all moneys collected for game licenses and certificates should be paid into the State Treasury to the credit of the General Fund rather than to a special fund, which has been known heretofore as "The State Game Fund". A definite amount for the conduct of the State Game Department was appropriated by the Legislature, said appropriations being payable from the General Fund. This change in the manner of handling the funds of the State Game Department is a decided improvement over the old system, since under the present law it is definitely known just what amounts are to be available for the conduct of this Department, and the payment of the license money direct to the General Fund is a benefit to that fund as it comes in at a time when the General Fund otherwise would be deficient.

A considerable balance remains in the old State Game Fund provided for in the old law, which balance it is recommended be transferred to the General Fund, with the proviso that appropriations heretofore made payable from the State Game Fund be paid from the General Fund.

#### UNIVERSITY AND AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE FUNDS.

Under the provisions of various acts of the Legislature, it has been the custom to pay over to the Treasurer of the University all of the funds appropriated and made available for the use of the University and the Agricultural College. This system prevents the State Treasurer from making any detailed statement relative to the financial operations of the University, the reports simply showing the amounts paid over in bulk to that institution, but



giving no information as to its expenditure. In order that the finances of this institution may be conducted in the same manner as those of other institutions, and the expenditures become a part of the records of the fiscal officers of the State, it is recommended that all funds of the University and Agricultural College be hereafter retained by the State Treasurer until such time as they are expended in the regular course upon warrant of the State Auditor as other funds are expended.

#### FEEES OF OFFICERS AND COMMISSIONS.

It is recommended that the laws be so amended as to provide that all fees collected by State Officers, Commissions and Departments, which are not already required to be paid into the General Fund, be hereafter required to be paid into that Fund, and that definite appropriations be made for the use of the officers or Departments thus affected. This system prevails in a large proportion of the Departments of the State, but there remain yet a few Departments where the fees of the officer or Departments are paid into a special fund, the whole amount of which is available for the use of that particular officer or Department. The custom in these matters should be uniform throughout.

## Report of The State Board of Deposits

The State Board of Deposits, consisting of Bryant B. Brooks, Governor, Chairman; Edward Gillette, State Treasurer, Secretary, and William R. Schnitger, Secretary of State, has carried out the provisions of Chapter 30 of the Session Laws of 1907 relative to considering applications of banks to be designated as State Depositories, the fixing of rate of interest to be paid upon State deposits placed with such Depositories, and the approving of bonds and securities offered as surety for said deposits.

The following named banks have made application in form prescribed by law and the regulations of the Board of Deposits, and have been designated by the Board as State Depositories since the organization of the Board, to-wit:

The rate of interest to be paid by State Depositories upon State deposits has been fixed by the Board for each year since the law went into effect at two and one-half per cent. per annum upon daily balances. This rate is considered by the Board to be a just and fair rate when it is considered that the cost of surety bonds to the banks is from one-half of one per cent. per annum to one per cent. per annum upon the amount of deposits carried, and, furthermore, because of the fact that in some of the Depositories at least, there are very large fluctuations of amounts on deposit and a scarcity of opportunity for investment of the funds by the Bank in short time paper.

The law as a whole appears to be working very satisfactorily and has resulted in a substantial gain to the State in interest received upon deposits, said interest amounting, as shown by the State Treasurer's Report, to \$12,047.51 for the seventeen months ending September 30, 1908, during which the law has been in effect.

The Board would recommend that the law be so amended as to provide that every State officer, employee, Department or Commission receiving funds to be held in escrow or pending the fulfillment of certain conditions, which funds are eventually to be paid into the State Treasury, or returned to the parties paying the same, shall be required to pay such funds to the State Treasurer to be held by him as trust funds until such time as they are finally disposed of, and that the State Treasurer be required to handle such trust funds in the same manner as other funds of the State with reference to the provisions of the Depository Law.
