Report of the State Treasurer

Recommendations and Remarks

The growth and prosperity of the State of Wyoming is indicated in the volume of its financial operations. Each year since Wyoming became a State the reports of its fiscal officers have shown a marked increase in the amount of money received and disbursed, evidencing a steady and healthy growth in the wealth and an improved condition of the business of the State. These facts are but a reflection of the generally prosperous conditions existing among the people of the State. The two years covered by this report are no exception to the general rule. The volume of business and amount of detail required for a safe handling and proper accounting of the funds has steadily grown. The State Depository Law and the Trust Fund Law, which are both excellent measures and are accomplishing good results, have very naturally increased the work of the Treasurer's Office. The constant growth of the Permanent Land Funds also causes an increased amount of detail in the matter of purchasing and handling securities representing investments of these funds.

THE GENERAL FUND.

The condition of what is known as the General Fund of the State, from which nearly all appropriations for the running expenses of state government are paid, is in a general way an index of the general financial condition of the State and its ability to meet current demands. During the time that our assessed valuations were kept at a low percentage of actual value, it was necessary to provide for many of our charitable and educational institutions by special tax levies in order to avoid exceeding the constitutional limit of four mills for general purposes, thus elim-

inating such charges from the General Fund. The change of plan whereby assessed valuations are now more nearly to real value, has so increased the total assessed valuation of the State as to make it no longer necessary to make special tax levies for charitable and educational purposes. All such charges can be met by a General Fund levy without exceeding the constitutional limit of four mills. The last legislature foreseeing this condition made most of its appropriations from the General Fund rather than from special tax levies, and this custom should be more generally adopted in the future, thus avoiding many of the special levies heretofore resorted to and simplifying the methods of accounting for State funds.

The fact that in the past appropriations have been made for certain purposes sometimes from the General Fund and at other times from special tax levies makes it difficult to compare intelligently the receipts and expenditures in the General Fund of any one biennial period with another. It may be stated, however, that on September 30th, 1908 the General Fund had a net balance to its credit of \$31,228.21, while at the present time (September 30th, 1910), if all warrants were paid the fund would be overdrawn \$16,769.19—a total difference of \$47,997.40 as compared with the condition two years ago. This apparent deficiency has been caused to a large extent by the change above-mentioned of the method of making appropriations. Appropriations become available for use at once, while it takes time to levy and collect the taxes with which they are to be paid. The tax levy of 1910, not yet collected, will raise for the General Fund \$126,000.00 more than did the tax of 1908—so it may be fairly predicted that upon the collection of the 1910 tax the General Fund will regain its former status, and the amount upon which to base appropriations for the coming two years will compare favorably with that of two years ago. The condition, however, is not one to warrant extravagance in future appropriations.

SURPLUS FUNDS.

In a number of instances in the past appropriations have been made of a fixed amount for certain purposes and at the same time it has been provided that special tax levies should be made to raise the amounts so appropriated. It is manifestly impos-

sible for the State Board of Equalization, in such cases, to so fix the levy as to raise just exactly the amount appropriated—no more and no less. The result has been that in some cases more has been raised than was appropriated, and it has therefore been necessary for the State Treasurer to carry the excess in such cases as "surplus" pending further action of the legislature directing its use. Surpluses appear in the following funds on September 30th, 1910.

Building for Female Insane Patients Fund— (Chap. 21 S. L. of 1907)	\$2,848.67

I would respectfully recommend that the foregoing amounts, together with any further amounts which may yet be received from the tax levies which gave rise to the funds, be appropriated for the benefit of the institutions for which the original appropriations were made. In the case of the University Dormitory Fund the appropriation should also include any surplus which may accrue from the levy of 1909 authorized by Chapter 26 of the Session Laws of 1909, as well as that of the levies of 1907 and 1908.

PENITENTIARY IN ALBANY COUNTY LAND INCOME FUND.

The Attorney General in an opinion rendered April 2, 1910, rules that the legislature has authority to appropriate the income and proceeds of the grant of land for the Penitentiary in Albany County, and direct the payment thereof into a fund for the use of the Penitentiary in Carbon County. I would respectfully recommend that an appropriation of this fund be made in accordance with said opinion.

DELINQUENT STATE TAX.

A special effort has been made by this office during the last two years to collect delinquent state tax. Counties have been urged to file any claims which they might have for rebates on account of double and erroneous assessments, and to make pay-

ment of all amounts due after such rebates have been duly examined and allowed. The County officials have cheerfully responded to our requests for attention to these matters, and the State Examiner has done much efficient work in checking and verifying claims for rebates and adjusting balances.

The results of these efforts have been very gratifying and I am able to report a less total amount due on account of delinquent state tax than was the case two years ago, notwithstanding that the total amounts levied during the past two years have exceeded those of former years. Four Counties have paid up in full and have no delinquency. Three other Counties have paid up in full and have this year for State deficiency, and the balance of the Counties are in good shape in this respect.

In this connection I wish to recommend legislation to the end that some limit of time be put upon the granting of rebates by the Boards of County Commissioners and the filing of claims with the State for its proportion of same. Under our present laws and customs Boards of County Commissioners may and do consider applications for rebates upon taxes levied many years previous, I believe that one year from the time taxes become delinquent should be the limit for the consideration of claims for rebates and that final settlement of Counties with the State should be required within the same limit of time.

THE LAND FUNDS.

Receipts from the land department continue to grow in volume. The total receipts from this department during the last two years have been \$519,235.71 as compared with \$402,509.59 for the previous two years. These figures include only the actual amounts received from the Commissioner of Public Lands, and are exclusive of amounts received from other sources but which may properly be credited to our land income. These would include the 5% of sales of United States Land, \$44,560.62; interest upon investments of permanent land funds, \$32,988.02; interest from land sources of permanent land funds, \$13,603.02. A grand total upon deposits of land funds, \$13,603.02. A grand total from land sources of \$610,387.37. Of this amount there has been disbursed to Counties for benefit of public schools \$290,272.59 being a per capita rate of \$4.86 for the year 1909 and \$5.04 for the year 1910.

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INVESTMENTS.

During the past two years the State Treasurer has purchased as an investment of permanent land funds bonds of Counties, School Districts and Municipalities of this State to the amount of \$208,300.00. During the same period bonds held as such investment have matured and been paid in the sum of \$40,432.00 leaving a net gain in this class of securities of \$167,868.00. The total amount of bonds held September 30, 1910 is \$447,454.00. These figures are exclusive of State Warrants held in investment accounts. The Treasurer has continued the practice of former years of investing permanent funds in Wyoming State Warrants whenever there has been a temporary lack of funds for payment of same when presented. This plan not only saves the State the interest upon said warrants which would otherwise be paid to the individual holders of the warrants, but it also saves the inconvenience and possible loss which individual holders would experience in attempting to negotiate them. The credit of the State is also maintained by the prompt acceptance of all warrants drawn upon the Treasury. A total of \$121,263.23 in State Warrants has been cared for in this manner during the past two years, of which \$25,711.27 remained in the investment account on September 30th, 1910.

It is a matter for congratulation to the State, as well as reflecting great credit upon the subdivisions thereof which have issued the bonds, that not one dollar of principal or interest of these investments has ever been defaulted.

THE BONDED DEBT.

On January 1, 1911, the last instalment of the "Capitol Building" and "University Building" bonds will become due and be paid. This will leave the total bonded indebtedness of the State at the small figure of \$120,000.00. The interest rate upon these bonds is high and some of them have still a number of years to run, but the plan outlined when the bonds were issued of paying them off in instalments, rather than refunding them, has proven to be a wise one. The State is gradually getting out of debt without serious hardship upon the tax payers. The bond issues remaining unpaid after January 1, 1911, will be—

In sane Asylum Building Bonds issued in 1887, due one-tenth each year beginning Jan. 1, 1912—6 %	\$30,000.00
Public Building Bonds issued in 1888, due one-tenth each year beginning July 1, 1919—6 %	90,000.00

THE DEPOSITORY LAW.

The total earnings under the Depository Law since it became effective May 1, 1907 to and including September 30, 1910, have been \$33,784.26 of which amount \$21,736.75 has accrued during the two years covered by this report. The last legislature amended the law in such manner as to include in its provisions amendments that are held in escrow, or pending the fulfillment of certain conditions. These funds are held by the State Treasurer as "Trust Funds" and so reported and accounted for. Under this provision of the law the State Treasurer has received a total of \$130,433.37 and disbursed \$75,188.55 leaving a present balance of \$55,244.82. The Trust Funds have earned \$889.94 from interest on deposits. The Trust Funds held on September 30, 1910 are classified as follows:

The last five items of the foregoing statement represent guaranty deposits of \$3.00 per acre for land under process of acquiring title from the general Government, the guarantors agreeing to bid at least \$10.00 per acre for the land when title is secured and the land is put up for sale. Aside from the title deposits of this character the State Treasurer held on September 30, 1910, in trust and for collection, Bank Certificates of Deposit aggregating \$85,707.26, representing guaranty deposits of the

same character. Since September 30, 1910, additional certificates of deposit of the same character amounting to \$10,544.50 have been received.

The State Treasurer also holds in trust a Certificate of Deposit for \$1,101.84 representing funds of the Wyoming Monitor Association, raised for the purpose of purchasing a silver service for the Monitor "Wyoming."

The Board has also, from time to time, approved the bonds and securities offered by banks for protection of State deposits, in compliance with the provisions of the Depository Law.

The rate of interest to be paid by State Depositories upon State deposits has been fixed by the Board for each year since the law went into effect at two and one-half per cent. per annum upon daily balances. This rate is considered by the Board to be a just and fair rate when it is considered that the cost of surety bonds to the banks is from one-half of one per cent. per annum to one per cent. per annum upon the amount of deposits carried, and, furthermore, because of the fact that in some of the Depositories at least, there are very large fluctuations of amounts on deposit and a scarcity of opportunity for investment of the funds by the Bank in short time paper.
