In Memoriam

The Treasury Department wishes to pay tribute to the late Frederick B. Sheldon, who served as Wyoming's only Deputy State Treasurer up to the time of his decease, March 19, 1913, covering a period of twenty-five years.

Mr. Sheldon's death caused a pang of regret in thousands of hearts throughout the length and breadth of Wyoming, but those who were closely associated with him feel the loss most keenly. Officially, he carried great responsibilities without shirking, and his knowledge of the financial condition and needs of the State were invaluable.

A character like that possessed by Mr. Sheldon is more priceless than fine gold. He was eminently fair, always just; his word was never questioned, and his life free from blame or criticism of any kind.

Report of the State Treasurer

RECOMMENDATIONS AND REMARKS.

The report herewith submitted shows a financial condition of the State of Wyoming which cannot but be most pleasing to its citizens and taxpayers.

This report has been prepared with a view of giving full information in detail of all fiscal transactions of the preceding two years, and the financial condition of the state at the present time. Each cash fund is reported separately, showing the amounts received and expended in each case and a detailed statement of the condition of the appropriation accounts is also given.

The transactions of the State Treasurer's office during the two years just past have been greater in volume than those of the two years immediately preceding.

The volume of business and amount of detail required for the safe handling and proper accounting of the funds has also greatly increased. The constant growth of the Permanent Land Funds from the sales of the public lands, has greatly increased, which requires more detail in the matter of purchasing and handling securities representing investments of these funds.

While the tax levy has decreased each year, the taxes collected have increased, and the volume of business has become greater, due to the natural growth of the state, therefore requiring more responsibility and labor in caring for the affairs of the office.

Owing to the large number of cash funds and the liability to confusion of titles, reference to the law creating the fund or governing its use is given in each case.

THE GENERAL FUND.

Notwithstanding the fact that the expenses of State Government have largely increased during the past two years, due to the natural growth of the state, the revenues have kept pace with the expenditures without an increase of rate of taxation for general

purposes, and the biennial period closed with a very substantial balance in this fund, which will be able to meet the claims upon it until the payment of state taxes into the Treasury.

DELINQUENT STATE TAX.

The total amount of delinquent state tax due the state at this time is less than at the corresponding date two years ago. For the period ending September 30, 1912, the delinquent tax amounted to \$38,447.29, while for the period ending September 30, 1914, it is \$29,541.16. Although, when considered upon a percentage basis, the condition is about the same as usually prevails. The condition this year is a decided improvement, as six counties were entirely free of debt to the state on September 30, 1914, namely: Albany County, Big Horn County, Carbon County, Fremont County, Niobrara County, and Uinta County. Practically all of the counties have shown a desire to pay up their delinquencies.

THE LAND FUNDS.

The total receipts from the Land Department during the last two years have been \$799,378.00, as compared with \$560,877.50 for the previous two years, and \$519,235.71 for the two years before that. These figures include only the actual amounts received from the Commissioner of Public Lands, and are exclusive of amounts received from other sources, but which may be properly credited to the land income. These would include the 5 per cent of sales of United States land, \$32,124.19; interest received upon investments of permanent land funds, \$60,725.32, and interest upon deposits of land funds (including interest on Trust Funds received from Land Department), \$40,257.71, a grand total of \$932,485.22 from land sources, and of this amount there has been disbursed to counties for the benefit of public schools \$443,823.42, being at the rate of \$5.97 per pupil for 1913, and \$6.47 per pupil for 1914.

INVESTMENTS.

The State Treasurer has purchased during the past two years bonds of Counties, School Districts and Municipalities of the State to the amount of \$278,750.00, an increase of \$127,750.00 over the biennial period ending September 30, 1912. During the same

period bonds held as such investment have matured and been paid in the sum of \$53,687.00, leaving a net gain of \$225,063.00. The total amount of bonds held on September 30, 1914, was \$779,875.00. The average rate of interest upon the investments for the past four years is 5.27 per cent.

All bonds, with but two or three exceptions, have been purchased direct from the County, School District or Municipality issuing the same, and in competition with other buyers. No securities held by the state have ever been defaulted, either in principal or interest.

To enable the State Treasurer to invest a larger portion of the Common School Permanent Land Funds, I would respectfully recommend an amendment to the Constitution authorizing the legislature to enact a law including the purchase of municipal bonds, with proper restrictions, as an investment of permanent School Funds.

THE BONDED DEBT.

During the last two years \$6,000.00 of Insane Asylum Building Bonds have been paid, and there now remains but \$111,000.00 of bonded indebtedness, as follows:

Three thousand dollars of this debt will be paid on January 1, 1915.

INTEREST ON DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS.

The State Treasurer has collected in interest upon deposits with banks within the state during the last two years a total of \$59,695.61, an increase over the two years preceding of \$25,205.23, and in interest on investments \$60,725.32, an increase of \$14,185.67 over the two years preceding, making a total interest of \$120,420.93, and a total increase of \$39,390.90 over the preceding two years.

The number of banks in which state funds are deposited has been increased under the present administration from twenty-three on January 1, 1911, to sixty-nine at the present time, it being the desire of this department to distribute the funds as nearly as possible over the entire state, which is no doubt to the benefit of the localities in which the banks are situated. Security Bonds or School Bonds for the deposit of state moeny are taken as required by law.

CONTINGENT FUNDS.

I would respectfully renew the recommendations as made in my former report, ending September 30, 1912, that all future appropriations for contingent expenses be made for fixed amounts covering the biennial period ending with the close of the fiscal year, March 31st of each odd-numbered year.

GAME DEPARTMENT.

The receipts from the Game Department have increased during the last two years, having amounted to \$53,794.12. The cost of maintaining the department for the same period has been \$21,002.84, which is considerably less than two years prior.

TRUST FUNDS.

These funds come almost entirely from the Commissioner of Public Lands, and represent in a large proportion funds deposited by prospective purchasers of state lands, as guarantee that they will bid the minimum price for same when title has been secured by the state, and the land is offered for sale. Seventy-one thousand, seven hundred eighteen dollars and forty-six cents less has been received during the last biennial period than was received during the two years preceding, due mainly to the change in 1911 of the law requiring prospective purchasers to deposit but 10% of the purchase price, whereas prior to 1911 the law required a deposit of 30%. The disbursements for the same period exceed those of the last biennial period \$98,763.81, which amount has been withdrawn by the Commissioner of Public Lands and deposited in the Permanent Land Funds. These Trust Funds are handled in the same manner as the regular funds of the state, under a separate accounting, and have earned from interest on deposits during

the last two years \$10,512.76. The following is a statement of Trust Funds received and disbursed during the period covered by this report:

The State Board of Deposits has also from time to time approved the bonds and securities offered by Banks for protection of State Deposits, said bonds and securities having in all cases been found to be in prescribed form, and the security being deemed sufficient in each case.

The rate of interest fixed by the Board to be paid by State Depositories upon deposits of state funds for the two years beginning May 1, 1913, and May 1, 1914, respectively, was three and one-half per centum upon daily balances, this rate being an advance of one-half of one per centum per annum upon the rate previously paid. On September 2, 1913, the Board reconsidered its action of April 15th and changed the rate back to three per centum per annum, to take effect September 1, 1913, which rate is now in force.

The operation of the State Depository Law as it now stands has been found to be most satisfactory, and the funds of the state are under the provisions of that law distributed very generally over the state, and are well secured and yielding a generous income.
