FOREWORD

Economic growth within the state has accelerated the tempo of every aspect of the multi-faceted duties of this office. An increased flow of funds and a sustained high level of interest rates has created the opportunity for record high levels on interest income earned for the state.

The total of all state funds on June 30, 1981, amounted to \$1,345,844,570, an increase over last year of 24.70 percent. Investment of the permanent funds, and daily investment of temporarily unneeded cash resulted in earnings of \$87,801,792. Retirement System investments produced earnings of \$22,180,254. The grand total of \$109,982,046 in interest income is an increase of 33.53 percent over the previous year.

New Legislation affecting the Board of Deposits' laws has increased our ability to provide flexibility in the rate on state deposits in Wyoming banks and savings and loan associations. Collateral requirements are somewhat eased by the acceptance of conventional mortgage loans as a pledge to the state.

Economic conditions must surely be contributing to the rapidly increasing demand for low-interest farm loans and joint powers loans made through the Farm Loan Board. The strain on the permanent funds is evident, and growing.

Legislation in the 1981 session of the Legislature made mortgages a permissive investment of any of the permanent funds not committed to other loans, up to \$100 million. Much effort has gone into structuring a workable program by converting by rule to a mortgage pass-through certificate program with a subsidized mortgage rate. Implementation can begin by increments in the next fiscal year, by investment of portions of the Permanent Mineral Trust Fund.

The new two percent severance tax on oil and gas will add another layer of distributions for this office. We have determined that distributions will be made on the following dates:

- 1) On or about September 15 of each year for the first and second quarters of collected revenues.
- 2) On or about December 15 of each year for the third quarter of collected revenues.
- 3) On or about April 1 of each year for the fourth quarter of collected revenues.

Other receipts will be carried forward to the September 15 distribution. Recipients are cities, towns, counties, Water Development Fund, and the Permanent Mineral Trust Fund, as well as the State Highway Fund.

All severance tax receipts for the two-month period, January and February, being challenged in court, and paid under protest, will be withheld from distribution and retained in a special account pending a court decision.

DUTIES OF THE OFFICE

Daily receipts from state agencies are acknowledged by official receipts and deposited for the agency. State warrants are redeemed from the bank each day, and filed for reference. All excess funds are invested daily, and interest earned is credited to the agency as pool fund interest. Interest accruing from the investments of permanent land funds is credited to the fund from which the investment was made; Permanent Mineral Trust Fund earnings are transferred at year end to the General Fund.

Retirement System investments are managed by an investment firm. The Treasurer's office handles settlement, payment and safekeeping functions for that department.

The office receives and maintains custody and records of all property under the provision of the Escheated Property law.

The office facilitates the deposit of funds in banks and savings and loans within the state, notifies the financial institutions of quarterly rates set by the Board of Deposits, maturities, payment of interest, and monitors collateral pledges under provisions of the law.

Distributions of various state and federal monies are made as prescribed by law to cities, towns, counties, and state agencies, as well as refunds to individuals for agricultural gas tax use, and Elderly and Disabled tax and utility refund.

Workers' Compensation is a division of the State Treasurer's Office.

ORGANIZATIONAL CHART OF STATE TREASURER'S OFFICE

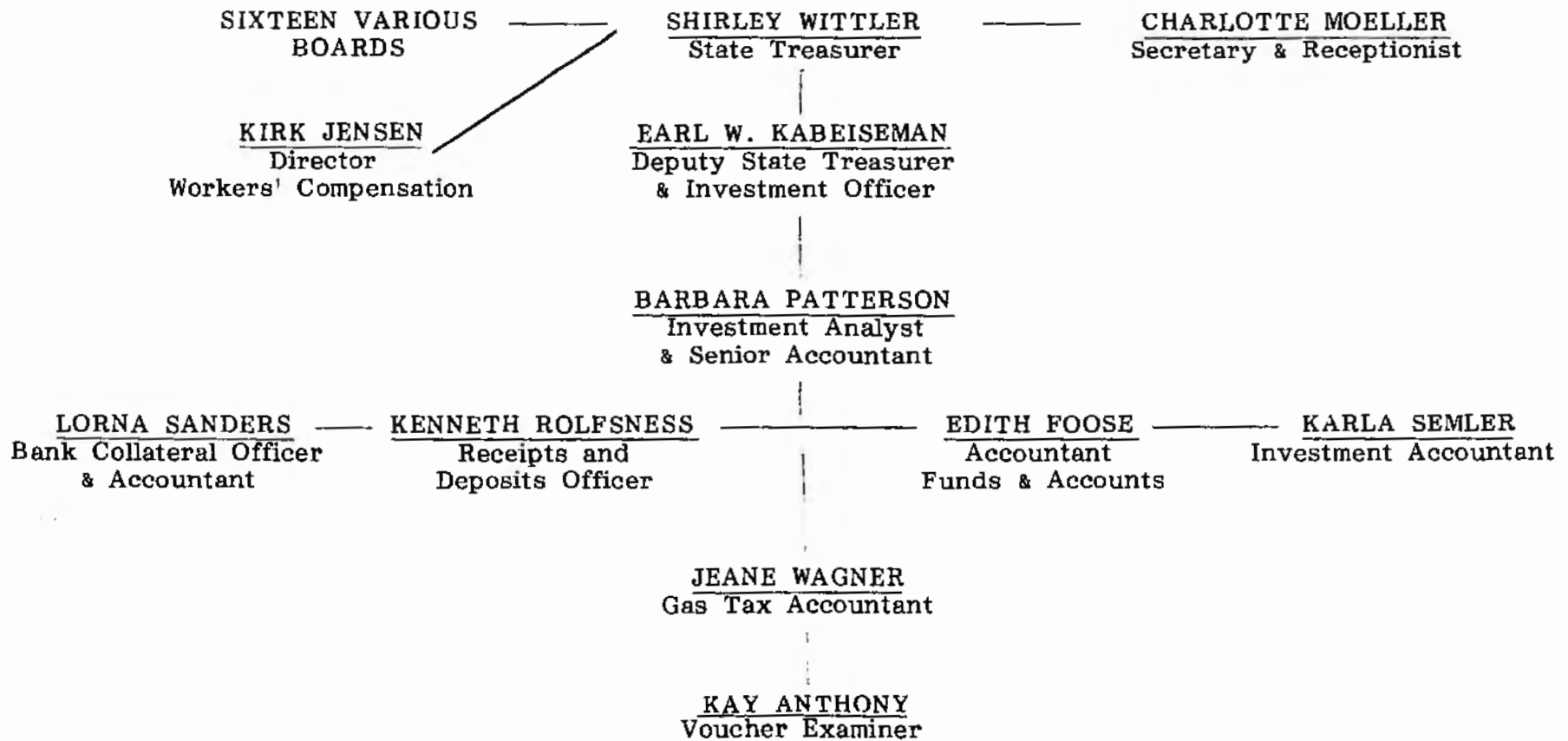

REPORT OF THE STATE BOARD OF DEPOSITS

The State Board of Deposits, consisting of the Governor, Secretary of State and State Treasurer, met on March 6, 1981, to consider the applications from Wyoming banks and savings and loan institutions to be designated as State Depositories under the provisions of the State Depository Law. One hundred three Wyoming state and national banks and thirteen savings and loan institutions were approved as depositories for state funds. Of those, one hundred one banks and all savings and loan institutions accepted deposits. Four new banks were designated as state depositories at regular quarterly sessions, making a total of one hundred five banks with state deposits by year end.

The Forty-Sixth Legislature passed new legislation concerning the State Board of Deposits. Chapter 31, Session Laws of Wyoming, 1981, amended Wyoming Statutes 9-7-1102, 1103, 1112 and 1122 to provide regular quarterly sessions to set interest rates and to collect quarterly interest. Chapter 14, Session Laws of Wyoming, 1981, amended Wyoming Statutes 9-7-1104, 1106, 1116, 1117, 1125(a) to provide the State Treasurer authorization to accept conventional real estate first mortgages as security at a ratio of one and one-half to one (1.5:1) of the value of public funds secured by the securities.

State of Wyoming INCOME VS. EXPENDITURES

July 1, 1980 through June 30, 1981

Received income for fiscal year 1981 increased \$328,764,209. This represents an increase of 33.86 percent over FY80. Disbursements increased \$214,377,296, or 26.32 percent over the previous fiscal year. The income total represents all monies received by the State Treasurer during the fiscal year. The Disbursements total represents the amount paid by the State Treasurer to redeem warrants for the fiscal year. Total disbursements cannot be equated to total expenditures, as warrants may be written in one fiscal year and not presented for payment until the following fiscal year. Internal transfers between agencies and accounts are not included in these statistics.

PERMANENT WYOMING MINERAL TRUST FUND

"The permanent Wyoming mineral trust fund is to be used to account for the proceeds from an excise tax, as shall be levied by constitutional or statutory law, on the privilege of extracting or severing certain minerals as may be designated by constitutional or statutory law. The proceeds of the fund shall be inviolate and shall constitute a permanent or perpetual trust fund which shall be invested or loaned to political subdivisions of the state, only as the legislature may direct. All income from the fund shall be deposited annually in the general fund." (Section 9-7-504, Wyoming Statutes Annotated, 1977 Republished Edition, and Article 15, Section 19, Wyoming Constitution)

The Legislature has approved a \$40,000,000 loan to the City of Cheyenne to help fund the Stage II water project. The qualified electors of Cheyenne must approve a \$40,000,000 debt issue before these funds will be made available. A \$100,000,000 subsidized Mortgage Purchase Program was approved during the 1981 legislative session. The mortgages will be purchased using monies from the Permanent Funds of the state. The State Treasurer anticipates that the majority of these mortgages will be purchased using the corpus of the Permanent Mineral Trust Fund.

Deferred Compensation is a supplementary retirement program, allowing public employees to set aside a limited portion of their earnings into a tax-deferred investment program. Amounts deferred and the earnings thereon are not subject to income taxes during the accumulation period. Amounts accumulated may not be withdrawn prior to 1) termination of employment; 2) financial hardship; 3) death; 4) disability, or 5) retirement, as provided by the plan.
