FOREWORD

At a period of drastically declining income from almost every source, the State of Wyoming is indeed fortunate to have one revenue source that is increasing--the investment income from all of our state invested monies. Many states do not have permanent funds as we do. The total of all funds in the State Treasury passed the \$2 billion mark during the year and is up by 23 percent over the preceding year. In spite of drastically reduced interest rates, and in spite of increased allocation by the legislature of permanent funds to subsidy programs, total income to the State Treasury has now exceeded \$150 million and is up 31 percent over the preceding year.

It is essential that the state continue to administer all its funds wisely, and it has become evident that changing conditions now require legislative changes. In contrast to the recent past, long-term investments are now returning a higher interest rate than short-term investments. The State Treasury needs to invest more money in the higher yielding long-term investments and less money in the short-term. To do this, the State Treasurer needs legislative authority to sell a security at less than acquisition price. This authority will also permit the Treasurer to: (1) Dispose of some old low-yielding investments and reinvest the money at higher rates, and (2) Continue the present state home mortgage program with out-of-state money instead of with permanent mineral trust funds. Potential gain to the state with this proposed legislative change is in the order of millions of dollars.

Another legislative change needed is authority for short-term borrowing by the State Treasurer. This is a sorely needed cash management tool to administer the legislatively mandated borrowing that is already in place, such as money for the school foundation program and other such short-term needs. It is only good business for the state to get this money from the cheapest source available. The present use of the permanent funds for this purpose is costing the state currently twice what it would if it were obtained from other sources.

During the year, the State Treasurer with the Farm Loan Board refunded the only bonds that the state has outstanding--the \$15 million community college construction issue. This will save the state \$1.3 million over the life of the bonds.

Chemical Bank of New York remains as the agent for safekeeping and investment transactions. American National Bank of Cheyenne is furnishing demand account bank services. All banks and savings and loans in the state are offered time deposits.

The capable and conscientious staff of the State Treasurer's Office remains almost the same as last year. The outgoing State Treasurer worked conscientiously to create an orderly transition for me as the new office holder. It will be a privilege and a challenge to serve the state for the next three and one-half years.

DUTIES OF THE OFFICE

Daily receipts from state agencies are acknowledged by official receipts and deposited for the agency. State warrants are redeemed from the bank each day, and filed for reference. All excess funds are invested daily, and interest earned is credited to the agency as pool fund interest. Interest accruing from the investments of permanent land funds is credited to the fund from which the investment was made; Permanent Mineral Trust Fund earnings are transferred at year end to the General Fund.

Retirement System investments are managed by an investment firm. The Treasurer's Office handles settlement, payment, and safekeeping functions for that department.

The office receives and maintains custody and records of all property under the provision of the Escheated Property law.

The office facilitates the deposit of funds in banks and savings and loans within the state, notifies the financial institutions of quarterly rates set by the Board of Deposits, maturities, payment of interest, and monitors collateral pledges under provisions of the law.

Distributions of various state and federal monies are made as prescribed by law to cities, towns, counties, and state agencies, as well as refunds to individuals for agricultural gas tax use, and Elderly and Disabled tax and utility refund.

Workers' Compensation is a division of the State Treasurer's Office.

ORGANIZATIONAL CHART OF STATE TREASURER'S OFFICE

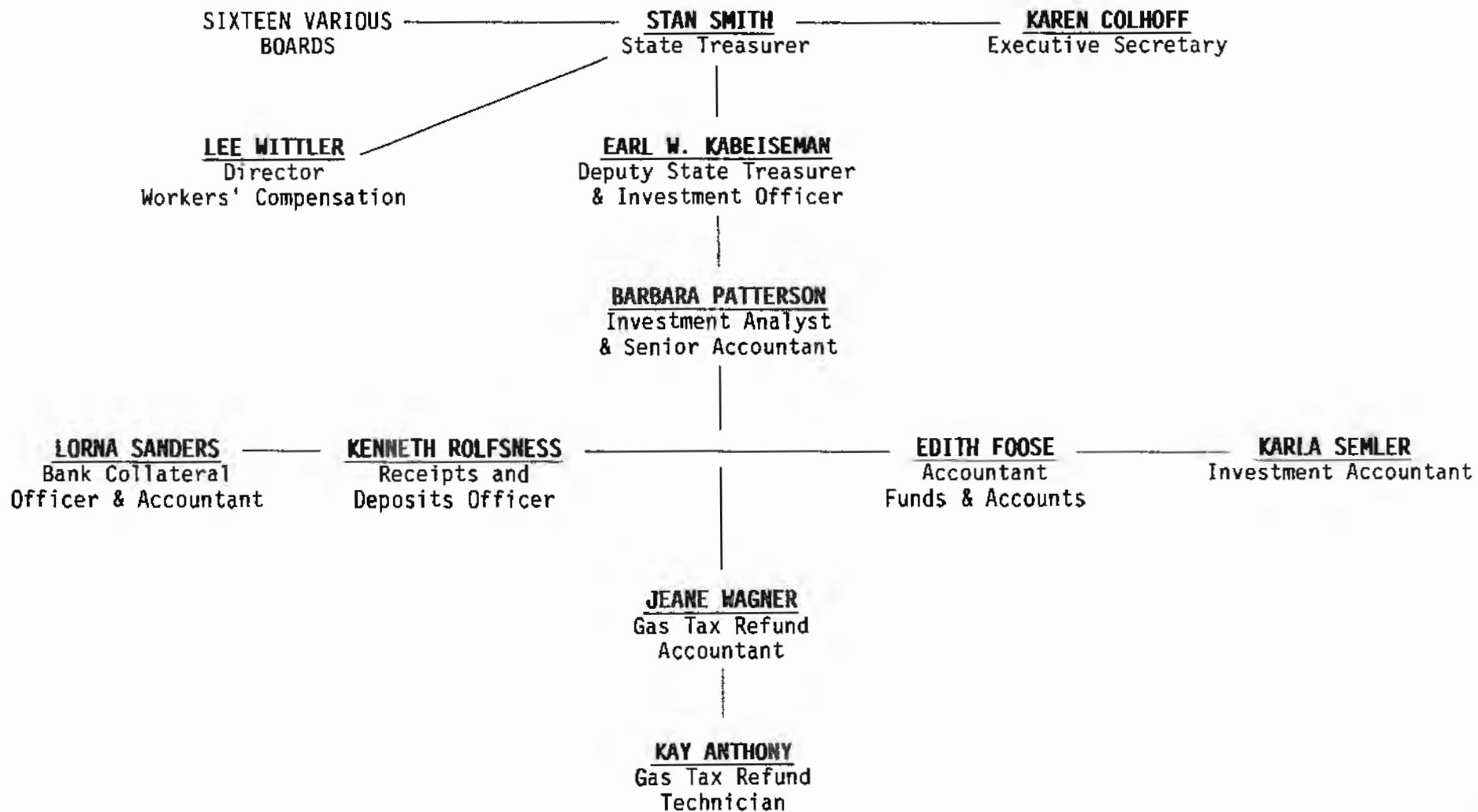

REPORT OF THE STATE BOARD OF DEPOSITS

The State Board of Deposits, consisting of the Governor, Secretary of State, and State Treasurer, met on March 7, 1983, to consider the applications from Wyoming banks and savings and loan institutions to be designated as State Depositories under the provisions of the State Depository Law. One new bank was designated as a State Depository, and it was noted that four banks had been sold and had name changes. The U.S. Comptroller of the Currency declared Western National Bank of Lovell insolvent and closed the bank on June 24, 1983. State deposits were protected by FDIC insurance and pledged collateral. One hundred twelve Wyoming state and national banks and thirteen savings and loan institutions were approved as depositories for state funds. Of those, one hundred eleven banks and all savings and loan institutions accepted deposits.

The Board of Deposits meets quarterly, in advance of each calendar quarter, to set the interest rate for the ensuing quarter. All deposits in excess of the federally insured amount of \$100,000 are protected by a pledge of specified securities or mortgage loans to the State Treasurer.

**STATE OF WYOMING
INCOME VS. DISBURSEMENTS**

JULY 1, 1982, THROUGH JUNE 30, 1983

Receipted income for fiscal year 1983 increased \$27,173,464. This represents an increase of 1.65 percent over FY 82. Disbursements increased \$61,847,036 or 5.18 percent over the previous fiscal year. The income total represents all monies received by the State Treasurer during the fiscal year. The disbursements total represents the amount paid by the State Treasurer to redeem warrants for the fiscal year. Total disbursements cannot be equated to total expenditures, as warrants may be written in one fiscal year and not presented for payment until the following fiscal year. STATE TREASURER'S MORTGAGE PURCHASE PROGRAM

The 1981 Legislature authorized the State Treasurer to invest up to \$100 million of state permanent funds in residential real estate mortgages, under specific restrictions and conditions. The State Treasurer filed rules to convert the investment to an insured mortgage pass-through certificate, representing a large pool of conventional mortgages. Mortgage Guarantee Insurance Corporation, through its subsidiary, MGIC Mortgage Marketing Corporation (Maggie Mae), was named to administer the mortgage purchases, create the pool, and issue the certificates. Certificates carry mortgage trust insurance, special hazard insurance, and pay principal and interest monthly to the holder.

PERMANENT WYOMING MINERAL TRUST FUND

"The permanent Wyoming mineral trust fund is to be used to account for the proceeds from an excise tax, as shall be levied by constitutional or statutory law, on the privilege of extracting or severing certain minerals as may be designated by constitutional or statutory law. The proceeds of the fund shall be inviolate and shall constitute a permanent or perpetual trust fund which shall be invested or loaned to political subdivisions of the state, only as the legislature may direct. All income from the fund shall be deposited annually in the general fund." (Section 9-7-504, Wyoming Statutes Annotated, 1977 Republished Edition, and Article 15, Section 19, Wyoming Constitution.)

The Legislature has approved a \$40,000,000 loan from the Permanent Mineral Trust Fund to the City of Cheyenne to fund the Stage II water project. The qualified electors of Cheyenne had to approve a \$40,000,000 debt issue before the funds would be made available to the City. The Cheyenne voters have approved the debt issue, but as of fiscal year end no funds have been advanced under the loan agreement. A \$100,000,000 subsidized Mortgage Purchase Program was approved during the 1981 legislative session. Three commitments in the amount of \$65.7 million have been closed and purchased for the Permanent Mineral Trust Fund. At fiscal year end a commitment to purchase up to \$34.3 million of mortgages was outstanding. The State Treasurer anticipates that any purchases made under the commitment will utilize the corpus of the Permanent Mineral Trust Fund.

Deferred Compensation is a supplementary retirement program allowing public employees to set aside a limited portion of their earnings into a tax-deferred investment program. Amounts deferred and the earnings thereon are not subject to income taxes during the accumulation period. Amounts accumulated may not be withdrawn except by: (1) Termination of employment; (2) Financial hardship; (3) Death; (4) Disability; or (5) Retirement, as provided by the plan.

The State Treasurer is named by statute as Administrator and has been assisted by a special board in implementing the plan. Members of the board are:

Enrollment began in 1979, with the selection of Nationwide Insurance as the carrier with a fixed annuity as the single option. Marketing and administration is coordinated by Wyoming Benefits, Inc. Under state law, the same program is offered to political subdivisions of the state.
